Comments: It appears that the only site being considered for nuclear waste is Yucca Mountain, NV.

There is an excellant alternative. Russia is interested in providing sites, and they have the ideal locations. They have vasts areas of Permafrost within the Arctic Circle, where only the top 2-to 4 feet temporarily thaws during the brief 2-month summer.

By blasting holes in this Permafrost, (for example, 50-100 feet deep) burying the waste and backfilling the top 10 feet with thawed material, (which would freeze over almost immediately) the waste would be locked in, not for the targetted 10,000 years.
