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TERMS & CONDITIONS FOR THE NON-FORAGE AND FORAGE RESERVE PASTURES

THE PASTURE AUMS ARE THE MAXIMUM AUMS ALLOWABLE WITHIN EACH PASTURE IRREGARDLESS OF THE SEASON AND PERIOD OF USE.

43 CFR 4120.3-1(A) STATES "RANGE IMPROVEMENTS SHALL BE INSTALLED, USED, MAINTAINED, AND/OR MODIFIED ON PUBLIC LANDS, OR REMOVED FROM THESE LANDS, IN A MANNER CONSISTENT WITH MULTIPLE USE MANAGEMENT."

FAILURE TO MAINTAIN ASSIGNED RANGE IMPROVEMENTS IS A PROHIBITED ACT UNDER 43 CFR 4140.1(A)(4),(5) WHICH COULD RESULT IN "... EQUIPMENT ON TEMPORARY WATER HAUL SITES WILL BE REMOVED WHEN NO LONGER REQUIRED OR AUTHORIZED IN ACCORDANCE WITH 43 CFR 4120.3-1(A) WHICH STATES "RANGE IMPROVEMENTS SHALL BE INSTALLED, USED, MAINTAINED, AND/OR MODIFIED ON THE PUBLIC LANDS, OR REMOVED FROM THESE LANDS,"

BIRD LADDERS ARE REQUIRED ON ALL WATER DEVELOPMENTS.

ON SITE INSPECTION WOULD BE COMPLETED TO DETERMINE AVAILABLE FORAGE AND GRAZING SEASON IN THE MODERATE AND MARGINAL POTENTIAL GRAZING PASTURES.

ANY PORTIONS OF THE ALLOTMENT WHICH ARE GRAZED DURING THE CRITICAL GROWING SEASON (FEBRUARY THROUGH APRIL 30) WILL BE RESTED THE NEXT YEAR. AREAS GRAZED IN THE "MONSOON" SEASON (MAY 1 THROUGH AUGUST 31) WILL BE RESTED THE NEXT YEAR IF AVERAGE PRECIPITATION IS LESS THAN 75% AREAS GRAZED DURING THE DORMANT SEASON (SEPTEMBER 1 THROUGH JANUARY 31) MAY REQUIRE RESTS BASED ON FORAGE CONDITION.

GRAZING WILL NOT OCCUR IN THE SPRING IF DROUGHT (LESS THAN 75% OF NORMAL PRECIPITATION) PERSISTS THROUGH THE WINTER.

ALLOWABLE USE LEVELS FOR UPLAND VEGETATION WILL NOT EXCEED 35% USE.

A MINIMUM OF 4 INCH REMAINING STUBBLE WILL BE LEFT AT THE END OF THE GROWING SEASON ON RIPARIAN AREAS.

WHEN ALLOWABLE USE LEVELS ARE REACHED IN AN AREA, LIVESTOCK WILL BE MOVED WITHIN THE PASTURE OR REMOVED FROM THE PASTURE.

THE LESSEE SHALL NOTIFY THE TFS TWO DAYS PRIOR TO THE TURNOUT OF

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LIVESTOCK

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TEMPORARY WATER HAUL SITES WILL BE USED TO DISTRIBUTE LIVESTOCK ON THE MAGRUDER MOUNTAIN ALLOTMENT. WATER HAUL SITES WILL BE ROTATED WITHIN A PASTURE TO AVOID RESOURCE DAMAGE.

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REQUEST FOR TEMPORARY WATER HAUL SITES WILL BE MADE TO THE AUTHORIZING OFFICER THREE MONTHS PRIOR TO THE ONSET OF GRAZING.

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THE APPLICANT IS RESPONSIBLE FOR REQUESTING THE TFS ARCHEOLOGIST'S ASSISTANCE FOR CULTURAL INVENTORY OF THE TEMPORARY WATER HAUL SITES.

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LIVESTOCK WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO CONCENTRATE AT ANY WATER HAUL SITES. LIVESTOCK WILL BE DISPERSED AND SEVERAL WATER HAUL SITES WILL BE USED AT THE SAME TIME.

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EQUIPMENT ON TEMPORARY WATER HAUL SITES WILL BE REMOVED WHEN NO LONGER REQUIRED OR AUTHORIZED IN ACCORDANCE WITH 43 CFR 4120.3-1(A) WHICH STATES "RANGE IMPROVEMENTS SHALL BE INSTALLED, USED, MAINTAINED, AND/OR MODIFIED ON THE PUBLIC LANDS, OR REMOVED FROM THESE LANDS, IN A MANNER CONSISTENT WITH MULTIPLE USE MANAGEMENT."

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PERSUANT 43 CODE OF FEDERAL REGULATIONS(CFR)10.4(G) THE HOLDER OF THIS AUTHORIZATION MUST NOTIFY THE AUTHORIZED OFFICER, BY TELEPHONE, WITH WRITTEN CONFIRMATION, IMMEDIATELY UPON THE DISCOVERY OF NATIVE AMERICAN HUMAN REMAINS, FUNERARY OBJECTS, SACRED OBJECTS, OR OBJECTS OF CULTURAL PATRIMONY (AS DEFINED AT 43 CODE OF FEDERAL REGULATIONS 10.2). FURTHER PERSUANT TO 43 CFR 10.4(C) AND (D), THE HOLDER MUST STOP ACTIVITIES IN THE VICINITY OF THE DISCOVERY AND PROTECT IT FOR 30 DAYS OF UNTIL NOTIFIED TO PROCEED BY THE AUTHORIZED OFFICER. THE HOLDER IS RESPONSIBLE FOR THE COST OF CONSULTATION, EVALUATION AND MITIGATION. ANY DECISION ON TREATMENT AND/OR MITIGATION WILL BE MADE BY THE AUTHORIZED OFFICER AFTER CONSULTING WITH THE HOLDER.

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SALT BLOCKS WILL BE PLACED MORE THAN ONE MILE FROM WATER DEVELOPMENTS

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IN ACCORDANCE WITH 43 CFR 4130.8-1(H): FAILURE TO PAY THE GRAZING BILL WITHIN 15 DAYS OF THE DUE DATE SPECIFIED IN THE BILL SHALL RESULT IN A LATE FEE ASSESSMENT OF \$25.00 OR 10 PERCENT OF THE GRAZING BILL, WHICHEVER IS GREATER, BUT NOT TO EXCEED \$250.00. PAYMENT MADE LATER THAN 15 DAYS AFTER THE DUE DATE, SHALL INCLUDE THE APPROPRIATE LATE FEE ASSESSMENT. FAILURE TO MAKE PAYMENT WITHIN 30 DAYS AFTER THE DUE DATE IS A VIOLATION OF SEC. 4140.1(B)(1) AND MAY RESULT IN ACTION BY THE AUTHORIZED OFFICER UNDER SEC. 4150.1 AND SUBPART 4160 OF THIS PART.

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43 CFR §4130.8-3(B) STATES: THE FOLLOWING TABLE OF SERVICE CHARGES IS APPLICABLE UNTIL CHANGED THROUGH THE FEDERAL REGISTER DOCUMENT AS PROVIDED IN PARAGRAPH (A) OF THIS SECTION. EXCEPT WHEN THE ACTION IS INITIATED BY BLM, THE AUTHORIZED OFFICER WILL ASSESS THE FOLLOWING SERVICE CHARGES:

ACTUAL USE REPORTS WILL BE TURNED IN WITHIN 15 DAYS AFTER THE END OF GRAZING SCHEDULE (43 CFR 4130.3-2(D)).

THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THIS PERMIT OR LEASE MUST BE CONSISTENT WITH THE STANDARDS AND GUIDELINES APPROVED FEBRUARY 12, 1997 FOR THE MOJAVE-SOUTHERN GREAT BASIN RESOURCE ADVISORY COUNCIL.

IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE TIMBISHA SHOSHONE FINAL LEGISLATIVE ENVIRONMENT IMPACT STATEMENT, IT IS ANTICIPATED THAT THE TIMBISHA TRIBE AND THE BLM WILL ENTER INTO A COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT FOR MANAGEMENT OF TRIBAL ACTIVITIES AND SPECIAL USE AREAS. WITHIN THE LIDA TRIBAL USE AREA, THE COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT WILL ENSURE TRIBAL ACCESS TO ALLOW PARTICIPATION IN PINYON NUT GATHERING AND RESOURCE PROTECTION ACTIVITIES. RESOURCE PROTECTION MAY INCLUDE; VEGETATION MANAGEMENT, RESTORATION OF SPRING SITES, EDUCATION PROGRAMS TO TEACH NON-TRIBAL PINYON NUT COLLECTORS HOW TO HARVEST NUTS WITHOUT DAMAGING TREES, AND DEVELOPMENT OF A PINYON PINE MANAGEMENT PLAN. THE PERMITTEE WILL BE INVITED TO WORK WITH THE TRIBE AND BLM FOR IMPLEMENTATION.

ADDITIONAL TERMS & CONDITIONS FOR THE FORAGE RESERVE

THE AUTHORIZED USE FOR MARGINAL POTENTIAL GRAZING PASTURE WITHIN THE MAGRUDER MOUNTAIN ALLOTMENT WAS ESTABLISHED IN THE MAGRUDER MOUNTAIN FINAL MULTIPLE USE DECISION, DATED SEPTEMBER 21, 2004.

ON SITE INSPECTION BY BLM SPECIALISTS WOULD BE COMPLETED TO DETERMINE AVAILABLE FORAGE AND GRAZING SEASON IN THE MARGINAL GRAZING PASTURE IN THE SOUTHERN PORTION OF THE MAGRUDER MOUNTAIN ALLOTMENT IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE DECISION 2 OF THE FMUD, SEPTEMBER 21, 2004.

THE MARGINAL POTENTIAL GRAZING PASTURE IN THE SOUTHERN PORTION OF THE MAGRUDER MOUNTAIN IS AVAILABLE ONLY DURING PERIODS THAT ARE ABOVE ANNUAL AVERAGE PRECIPITATION AS DETERMINED BY THE BLM. GRAZING WILL NOT OCCUR IN THE SPRING IF DROUGHT (LESS THAN 75% OF NORMAL PRECIPITATION PERSISTS THROUGH THE WINTER MONTHS. ANY PORTIONS OF THE ALLOTMENT WHICH ARE GRAZED DURING THE CRITICAL GROWING (FEBRUARY THROUGH APRIL 30) SHOULD BE ENTIRELY RESTED THE FOLLOWING YEAR. AREAS GRAZED IN THE MONSOON SEASON (MAY 1 THROUGH AUGUST 31) SHOULD BE RESTED THE NEXT YEAR IF AVERAGE PRECIPITATION IS LESS THAN 75% OF NORMAL. BLM MAY DETERMINE BASED ON MONITORING THAT AREAS GRAZED DURING THE DORMANT SEASON (SEPTEMBER 1 THROUGH JANUARY 31) MAY REQUIRE RESTS BASED ON FORAGE CONDITION.

THE MARGINAL POTENTIAL GRAZING PASTURE - SOUTH PORTION OF THE MAGRUDER MOUNTAIN ALLOTMENT WILL BE MANAGED BY THE LESSEE AS A FORAGE

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RESERVE. ANY APPLICANT WHO APPLIES TO DENVER SQUARE TRUST TO MAKE GRAZING USE IN THE FORAGE RESERVE MUST MEET THE FOLLOWING CRITERIA IN THE EVENT OF MULTIPLE OR CONFLICTING APPLICATIONS:

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A. PRIORITY 1: THE APPLICANT HAS A GRAZING PREFERENCE AND FEDERAL GRAZING PERMIT OR LEASE WHICH IS CURRENTLY IN GOOD STANDING WITH BLM.

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B. PRIORITY 2: THE APPLICANT IS CURRENTLY PLACING AUMS IN VOLUNTARY NON-USE FOR PROTECTION OF THE RANGELAND RESOURCES IN ANOTHER ALLOTMENT WHERE THEY HAVE AN ESTABLISHED GRAZING PREFERENCE AND PERMIT OR LEASE.

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C. PRIORITY 3: THE APPLICANT'S ACTIVE USE HAS BEEN TEMPORARILY REDUCED AND AUMS PLACED INTO TEMPORARY SUSPENSION DUE TO DROUGHT, FIRE DISEASE, AND/OR INSECT INFESTATION.

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D. PRIORITY 4: THE APPLICANT HAS A HISTORY OF COMPLIANCE WITH THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF GRAZING PERMITS AND LEASES OF THE BLM AND ANY OTHER FEDERAL OR STATE AGENCY. THE APPLICANT'S RECORD DOES NOT INCLUDE ANY RECORD OF SUSPENSIONS OR CANCELLATIONS OF GRAZING USE FOR VIOLATING AGENCY TERMS AND CONDITIONS, OR GRAZING REGULATIONS.

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E. PRIORITY 5: IF ALL OF THE CRITERIA ABOVE ARE MET BY MORE THAN ONE APPLICANT, THE FIRST APPLICATION RECEIVED WOULD BE THE FIRST AUTHORIZED.

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THE OPEN SEASON FOR APPLYING FOR THE FORAGE RESERVE WILL BE FROM OCTOBER 1 TO NOVEMBER 30 ON A YEARLY BASIS.

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THE LESSEE MAY USE THE AREA THE FOLLOWING GRAZING YEAR IN THE AREA DESIGNATED AS THE FORAGE RESERVE IF NO APPLICATION FOR THE FORAGE RESERVE IS RECEIVED DURING THE OPEN SEASON.

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IMPLEMENTATION OF THE FORAGE RESERVE WILL BEGIN ON MARCH 1, 2008.

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THE LESSEE WILL HAVE THE RESPONSIBILITY IN SELECTING THE APPLICANT FOR THE FORAGE RESERVE AND DENY AN APPLICATION AT HIS DISCRETION. A SIGNED PASTURE LEASE AGREEMENT MUST BE SUBMITTED BY DENVER SQUARE TRUST ALONG WITH AN APPLICATION TO BLM PRIOR TO ALLOWING LIVESTOCK OWNED BY ANYONE OTHER THAN DENVER SQUARE TRUST TO GRAZE WITHIN THE GRAZE WITHIN THE MAGRUDER MOUNTAIN ALLOTMENT.

The Bureau of Land Management manages more land--261 million surface acres--than any other Federal agency. Most of this public land is located in the 12 Western States, including Alaska. The BLM, an agency of the U.S. Department of the Interior, also administers 700 million acres of on-shore minerals throughout the nation.

Congress created the General Land Office (GLO) in 1812 to handle the increasing land business from the rapid westward expansion. The GLO was given the responsibility for maintaining the land and mineral records. These and other land and mineral records are now maintained by the BLM, which is entrusted with keeping what today amounts to more than two billion records. Many of these records are now available through this site.

Who would benefit from using this website?


This website was designed for those who work in the oil and gas industry, title companies, utilities, state and local governments, etc. that require access to BLM land and mineral records. Previously the only way a person could access this information was to visit one of the BLM Information Access Centers. This website enables users to access the same information over the Internet. We have provided a tutorial to guide you through the reporting system. If you need assistance, please visit or call the BLM Information Access Center nearest you.

What information does this system provide access to?

This system provides access to the following systems within LR2000:

- **Case Recordation** contains information on leases, permits, contracts, grants, agreements, mineral patents, etc. issued by the BLM on federal actions affecting public lands of the United States. Authorizations are issued for the following activities: oil and gas, coal and other minerals, sand, gravel, rights-of-ways, land exchanges and acquisitions, land use withdrawals, mineral patents, land classifications, land claims, land sales, etc. Information on the use authorization includes customer data, location, date of issuance, the actions that have taken place, and other applicable information.
- **Legal Land Description** contains cadastral survey data including meridian, township, range, section, survey type (aliquot part, lots, homestead survey, mineral survey, tracts, parcels, etc.), acreage, and geopolitical information including the geographic state, county, field office, and surface management agency (BLM, Forest Service, etc.). The surface management agency in LLD is coded as BLM, even when the land is privately owned, unless the land is located within a National Park, National Forest, etc.
- **Mining Claim Recordation** contains information on unpatented mining claims located on federal lands including claimant name, approximate location, and other applicable information. Mineral patents are not contained in Mining Claim Recordation.
- **Status** contains information on title transfer documents, such as land patents and warranty deeds, to and from the United States Government. Status also contains withdrawal information which is used to determine surface and subsurface segregation's on a parcel of land.

Want to view, search, and access your land and mineral



records using a map viewer?

BLM's [Geocommunicator](#) interactive map viewer allows you to search and display most of the land and mineral, status, and mining claims case records along with a variety of reference maps including surface management agency boundaries, T/R/Sec/Aliquot, rivers, roads, topo maps, and imagery.

You can link from GeoCommunicator directly to LR2000 to get a serial register page or a township georeport. It's fast and easy to use and best of all you don't need to format your serial number. GeoCommunicator is meant to compliment LR2000 with mapping capabilities not replace it. LR2000 will always be the definitive source for the records.

GeoCommunicator Land & Mineral Use Records Viewer

For example, in GeoCommunicator you can search for a mining claim by serial number, claim name, by place name, by township/range, latitude/longitude, or by zooming into a map. You can see all of the active or closed mining claims in your area. You can toggle on and off reference maps such as roads, rivers, aerial photography, topomaps, and surface management agency boundaries to help you locate your area of interest. Use the identify tool to find out details about the claim and to link to LR2000 to get a serial register page. You can label and print your map.

What information is not available through the LR2000 website?

Information on Alaska records are not available from this site. For more information, go to the [Alaska State Office website](#). The original documents including patents (some are available at the Federal Land Patent Records website), deeds, leases, public land orders, and case files are not available over this website but can be viewed in the BLM Information Access Centers. Case Recordation does not include information on grazing, timber, mineral production, recreation, or other natural resource programs. For more information on other programs in the Federal Government use [USA.gov](#).

The General Land Office (GLO) [Federal Land Patent Records](#) Website provide live access to Federal land conveyance records for the Public Land States. They also provide image access to more than two million Federal land title records for Eastern Public Land States, **issued between 1820 and 1908**. Images of Serial patents (land titles issued between 1908 and the mid-1960's) are currently being added to the Land Patent Website.

The LR2000 website provides land patent serial register pages from our Status System through the mid-1990s and in the Case Recordation System (see above) after that time.

To access this system **you must use Microsoft Internet Explorer for your browser.**
